Seeing him up the tree Jesus stopped and invited himself into Zacchaeus' home. Our Vision and Mission statements are designed to help us get a better view of Jesus who we believe is often 'passing our way' and longs to be 'at

These three short phrases above are the Parish Vision Statement. In the Diocesan Pastoral Plan Bishop Richard asks us to make prayer the foundation of all our work. He talks about the Church's idea of 'formation' as writes that this is a life-long journey of closer conformity to Christ which is the very purpose of our lives. Something we do together. He challenges us further when he says, "Mission calls us outward, beyond the safety of that with which we are comfortable." That is to actively participate in the life and work of our Parish.

# A Message from Charles Wookey, chair of finance and property committee

The tile replacement of the roof is proceeding to plan. As you know, we have unfortunately had some water ingress while the work continues, but the tile replacements are now well advanced, and the interior work will also soon be completed. Unfortunately, close inspection with the scaffolding up has revealed more weathering and damage than anticipated to the stonework, and so there is a need for significantly more extensive renovation of external stone work. Given the lead time in ordering the necessary stonework, this will result in a likely increase in the overall project costs and an extension of the scaffolding around the church until February/March.

There has been some wonderful early support for the fundraising needed to pay for the roof.

The September event raised around £2.5k, and we have received donations of around £12.5k, including new standing orders which will raise £8k each year. Whilst a great start, these sums are only scratching the surface of the £500k target we set over 10 years. We urgently need as a community to do more. Alongside occasional events (and the carol service at 7pm on 14th December 2025 is the next opportunity to raise funds), we also need more people to commit standing orders. 250 people committing £15 per month will raise over £50k a year (with gift aid). Do please consider what you may be able to afford on a regular basis.
